Embark on your journey to enjoy one of Singapore's famous pastimes... eating! Do you know that you're located just minutes away from Changi's famous culinary spots? You are probably the envy of many locals who would travel across the island just to get to them.

Season Live Seafood Restaurant

EAT

Take a bumboat ride to Pulau Ubin and savour fresh seafood in an ambience that's reminiscent of the good old kampung days. Located right by the jetty where you disembark, enjoy the view of the sea while dining under a huge tent.

Changi Village Hawker Centre

Home to many notable hawker stalls, be spoilt for choice as you feast your eyes on the affordable food spread. It's most famous for being a *Nasi Lemak* haven amongst locals so dress down and be prepared to brave snaking queues!

The Coastal Settlement

Former army barracks turned casual dining restaurant, this hidden gem serves artful Western and Asian creations for both intimate affairs and large gatherings. Although *ulu*, it is almost always packed. Place reservations to avoid disappointment.

PLAY

Enjoy the sun, the sand and the sea! From parks to boardwalks and offshore islands, recreational options in Changi are plenty and one-of-a-kind. Whether you are with friends or family, make the most of being away from city bustle to create new, unique and fun memories.

Changi Point Coastal Walk

Take a leisurely stroll along Changi's scenic coastline via a boardwalk that's not known to many. Divided into six distinct sections, the 45-minute walk begins from Changi Creek (near Civil Service Club) and stretches all the way to Changi Point. Look out for the Kelong Walk section where the boardwalk is built above water and extends into the sea on stilts, reminiscent of the *kelong* days of the past.

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Changi Beach Park

Explore one of Singapore's oldest coastal parks known for its *kampung* ambience and enjoy the sea breeze as you watch aeroplanes preparing to land. This is a popular family hangout on weekends for overnight picnics, barbecues, fishing, and watching the sunrise.

Pulau Ubin

Take a bumboat ride back to the 1960s! *Pulau Ubin* is an island touted as Singapore's last *kampung*, so get the most out of life in the slow lane as you pedal through rustic roads, explore trails and feast on fresh catches of the day.

Explore the road less travelled to discover more about the heritage, culture and biodiversity of Singapore through Changi. From natural wetlands to museums and places of worship, there's so much more to Singapore.

The Changi Museum & Chapel

Deepen your knowledge of Singapore's wartime history and discover the significance of Changi during the Japanese Occupation in an emotional telling of the fall of Singapore and the infamous Changi Prison. Touted online as a must-visit location by locals and tourists alike!

Replica of the St. Luke's Chapel, Artefacts, Personal Stories

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Loyang Tua Pek Kong Temple

Pay a visit to a unique temple that houses deities of different religions under one roof! Reflecting the religious harmony in Singapore, this temple has Buddhist, Hindu and Taoist deities, and a Muslim Kramat, all within its premises.

Tua Pek Kong, Tallest Ganesha statue in India and Singapore

Chek Jawa Wetlands

Hop onto a bumboat ride to get to one of Singapore's richest ecosystems, where only the observant will get to see plants and animals that are no longer common elsewhere in Singapore. Catch them at low tides along the boardwalk or head to the 21-metre viewing tower for a bird's-eye view of the wetlands.

TALK

SINGAPORE SLANG

9 Singlish (Singaporean English) words to get you started.

LAH

Used at the end of sentences to indicate tone of anger or agreement e.g. Yes lah... / Yes lah!

LEH

Used at the end of sentences to sound more placating in a disagreement or to persuade e.g. No leh... / Yes leh, he did leh. / Go leh.

LOR

Used at the end of sentences to agree or give in e.g. Ok lor. / Go lor.

MEH

Used questioningly e.g. No meh? / Yes meh?

WAH LAO

Exclamation to express shock or disappointment e.g. Wah lao! / Wah lao... How could he do that?

ALAMAK

Exclamation to express when one makes a mistake e.g. Alamak, I forgot my passport!

PAISEH

Sorry; used to express embarrassment or apology e.g. Paiseh, I didn't mean to knock into you.



Crazy

e.g. Šiao! That's daylight robbery.

Tastes or feels good e.g. This burger/massage is so shiok!
